From Earth's view, Venus goes through phases like the Moon.



Telescopic view of Jupiter and three of four Galilean moons




Space probe view

Jupiter is the largest planet in the Solar System

Ten Earths could fit across its diameter. It is a gas giant, made up mostly of hydrogen and helium, with possibly no solid surface like our planet has. While it has as many as 63 moons, four—those discovered by Galileo—are readily visible through a small telescope. Come see for yourself.

We'll also be turning our telescopes on the Full Moon on the night of November 10th!
